



Let's try the second approach. In the main navigation on the left of the page, click "[Simple Search](#)." To use this approach, you type keywords into the box and click "Begin Search." TICAL will search for your keywords in both the resource titles and in their abstracts. Simple search is easy to use, but its effectiveness is greatest when you choose your keywords and phrases with care. Below the search box are some tips that can help you craft very accurate searches and increase the chances of finding just what you want—and nothing more.

Finally, take a look at "[Advanced Search](#)." In this approach, you target your search by setting a series of filters. Like the matrix search, you can narrow your search to a specific topic and sub-topic. In addition, you can hone in on resources specifically recommended for certain positions such as superintendent or principal. Another advantage of the advanced search approach is that you can choose to see all resources on a given topic. You can also search according to special programs such as the National Educational Technology Standards for Administrators (NETS-A) or AB 430.
